OVERVIEW

The Hugh Wynter Fertility Management Unit (HWFMU) continued to consolidate its programmes and services during 2014/15. HWFMU in expanding its teaching and service capacity in assisted reproduction hosted a regional workshop funded by Ferring International for obstetrician/gynaecologists. It is anticipated that close collaboration will be fostered through this initiative to increase the number of clients from around the Caribbean for fertility treatment in the HWFMU.

The Unit in collaboration with the UWI Legal Unit had two workshops to review and finalize the consent forms for reproductive services. The forms are now in use.

The final report of the audit undertaken by the UWI's audit department was discussed and steps have been taken to implement the various recommendations in collaboration with the relevant offices.

The Unit continues to use available opportunities to promote and improve its services and anticipates significant growth in 2015/16.

The National Family Planning Board has not been able to supply the Unit with Subdermal implants (Jadelle and Zarin) hence the reduction in amount inserted.

Diagnostic Laparoscopy has been reduced with doctors preferring to do Operative Laparoscopy when a patient has Chronic Pelvic Pain.

Tubal Ligation is now done under general anaesthesia, costs have increased and hence a reduction in the number of persons seeking tubal ligation.
