OVERVIEW

The Hugh Wynter Fertility Management Unit in the review period intensified its clinical services, training, research and outreach activities. Ongoing tooling of the clinical infrastructure was undertaken to facilitate the use of modern surgical techniques and to support the training of undergraduate and post graduate medical students. The retooling is also central for the collaboration with international training partners such as the International Society for Gynaecologic Endoscopy (ISGE), with whom the Unit has partnered and is developing the plan to host training for obstetricians/gynaecologists in a week of intensive endoscopic training in September 2018.

The review of curriculum for the Masters in Counselling by Distance Education programme which was suspended for 2017/18 is in progress and discussions have been held on the delivery mode. The plan is to finalize the curriculum and delivery arrangements by the end of the academic year 2017/18.

The Unit continued its thrust to improve the knowledge and skills of obstetricians/gynaecologists in fertility treatment by hosting a two-day workshop in July 2018 on in vitro fertilization (IVF) and diagnostic hysteroscopy. The training was held in collaboration with Ferring Pharmaceuticals, Roche, and MorePharma Pharmaceutical Company. The participants were from Jamaica and the wider Caribbean.

Recommendations of the 2017 quality assurance report are continuously being addressed. Measures are being taken to seek national accreditation for the IVF laboratory as the initial action in the preparation for international accreditation.

The Unit is also in the process of reviewing and assessing its operations towards developing a new strategic plan that will be aligned to the UWI's Triple A Strategy for 2017–2022.

Programme Status

The intake of new students to the programme was suspended for the academic year 2017–2018 in order to improve the overall efficiency of its delivery. The curriculum which has been revised in line with the American 2016 Council for Accreditation of Counselling and Related Educational Programmes (CACREP), is currently being reviewed to increase its marketability.

Graduation

Eight students from the following sites graduated in October/November 2017: Belize (1); Dominica (4); Mona (1) and Trinidad (2).

A total of six students from the following sites have been recommended for graduation in October/November 2018: Dominica (1); Mona (1); St. Lucia (2) and Trinidad (2).

Courses offered

Five courses were offered as well as supervision of the research project.

Most of the students had already completed the taught courses and were working on their research projects.

- Visit to the Mona High School: Our Sessional Nurse, Nurse Joan Meade, delivered a presentation on the different forms of Contraceptives to the sixth form students at the Mona High School student on Friday, October 20, 2017.
- Christmas Treat: On December 15, 2017, the HWFMU staff made donations and hosted a Christmas Treat for the children at the Anne Dawson Home for Children located in St. Andrew.
- The University Research Days (URD) 2018: The HWFMU participated in the annual UWI URD held February 7–9, 2018.
- Endometriosis Month 2018: The director, Dr. Vernon DaCosta, as well as, the other HWFMU Consultants participated in several radio interviews during the commemoration of Endometriosis Awareness Month.
- The Launch of Visanne: With the Unit's leading role and expertise in the treatment of Endometriosis and Infertility, the director, Dr.

Vernon DaCosta, was invited to chair the Bayer Healthcare's "Launch of Visanne" on April 18, 2018 and was responsible for the endorsement of the drug, Visanne. Prior to the Launch, he participated in radio interviews on Endometriosis and how the drug, could assist in the treatment of Endometriosis. - The IVF and Hysteroscopy Workshop: As part of our mandate in improving sexual and reproductive health and training of clinicians in Jamaica and across the Caribbean, The HWFMU through an ongoing partnership with Ferring Pharmaceutical and new sponsor Roche Diagnostics Central America and The Caribbean hosted a two-day workshop at the HWFMU on July 13-14, 2018. Fourteen (14) Obstetricians and Gynaecologists from Jamaica and across the Caribbean were equipped with the novel methodologies and skills for treating infertility and performing Hysteroscopy.
- The Website Launch: The HWFMU has increased its effort in the promotion of its products and services; and through the hiring of a third party promotional team, ItsPixelPerfect, we have successfully launched our newly developed Website, Artificial Intelligence bot and Social Media platforms on July 13, 2018.
