

# DEPARTMENT OF SURGERY, RADIOLOGY, ANAESTHESIA & INTENSIVE CARE

## WORK IN THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Surgery, Radiology, Anaesthesia and Intensive Care (SURRAIC), is the largest clinical department in the Faculty of Medical Sciences with four divisions namely Surgery, Radiology, Anaesthesia and Intensive Care and Emergency Medicine. During the year under review over 1500 undergraduates and postgraduates rotated through our Department and benefited from our teaching and learning. The Department also strives to provide leadership in research relevant to the region and clinical services and outreach to the deserving public. With this in mind we structured the Department's strategic plan on the pillars of: teaching and education, research, clinical services, infrastructure and outreach are aligned with the UWI guiding pillars of Access, Alignment and Agility.

#### **ACCESS**

## **Teaching and Education**

Measures aimed at improving the quality of teaching and learning at both the undergraduate and postgraduate levels were undertaken. This included a further revision of the learning objectives for all courses delivered by the SURRADIC Faculty and the inclusion of a mid-rotation formative assessment for our students. The Department's synchronised delivery of structured lectures and tutorials to our students at all teaching sites will be made easier with the commissioning of the Peter Fletcher Lecture Theatre which was refurbished during the academic year and will be our main site for the online delivery of lectures from the Mona Campus. The Skills Laboratory at the Faculty of Medical Sciences, Teaching and Research Complex (FMST&RC) is now the central clinical examination site. The use of this site for clinical skills acquisition is still limited, and we anticipate an increasing importance in this simulated environment for teaching in the upcoming year.

The integration of information technology in teaching and learning continues to be a major area of focus for the Department. All our multiple choice examinations are now done electronically which has led to significant cost savings in the printing of paper and the increase in usage of virtual classrooms using the Our Learning Environment (OurVLE) and Blackboard platforms have also continued apace. Our passes in the MBBS Surgery continues to be good with 93percent of our students being successful in the recent examinations.

All postgraduate programmes, except two, have developed approved curricula; these include structured tutorials and the mandatory skills sessions in the simulated environment of the CHASE Carnegie Skills Laboratory. Structured sessions for anatomy, led by the Faculty, were introduced for our postgraduate residents as a direct response to the relatively poor passes in this subject area at the DM Part 1 Examinations.

During the period under review the Department benefited from several international guest lectures led by MBBS External Examiner, Professor Ralph George from the University of Toronto. Additional presenters were Professor Ronnie Sebro, Department of Radiology, University of Pennsylvania and Professor Arthur Burnett from John Hopkins University. The Department in conjunction with the Guttmann's Institute from Barcelona and the Ministry of Health also held a mini symposium in November 2018 on "The Multidisciplinary Approach to Rehabilitation". The FMS, SURRADIC

and Gillette Children Hospital celebrated the 10th Anniversary of the Spasticity Workshops in May 2019. Given the high burden of trauma generally including road traffic accidents in the society and the limited rehabilitation services currently available, rehabilitation will be an area for increase clinical services and research for the Department in the upcoming years.

#### RESEARCH

Members of the Department continue to play an active part in research and research related activities. We have not met the target of 1.5 publications per academic staff but for this academic year we have seen a marginal increase in our peer reviewed publications compared to the previous year. Our efforts at attracting more funded research was met with limited success.

The Department's partnership with the Association of Surgeons in Jamaica which saw the development of Guidelines for Selected Surgical Diseases culminated with the publication of a Supplemental in the *West Indian Medical Journal*. In addition to an editorial on the importance of guidelines and protocols in modern surgical care, the surgical diseases covered included acute gallstones pancreatitis, diabetic foot infections, breast cancer, colorectal cancer, preoperative anaesthesia evaluation, gallstones in patients with sickle cell disease, and ICU admission and discharge criteria. The impact of these guidelines can be measured by pre-and post implementation audits and these are currently being investigated by the faculty.

The 17th staging of the Caribbean Neurosciences Symposium and Charity Golf Tournament was held in February 2019 at the Montego Bay Convention Centre. Topics included areas of cancer, spine infection, stroke, trauma, track and field injury prevention and cannabis research. The Symposium was organised and hosted by the Caribbean Neurological Association along with the Department of Surgery, Radiology, Anaesthesia and Intensive Care and the Division of Neurosurgery at the University Hospital of the West Indies.

The Department held its 29th Annual Research Evening in March 2019 and this event was made successful with the donations of various prizes for outstanding presenters. Guest speaker Professor Marvin Reid, spoke on, "Collaborative Networks: The Basis for Advancement in the Sciences". The main prize of JA\$100,000.00 was won by Dr Ruth-Ann Myers for her presentation entitled "Post-Operative Vomiting in the Paediatric Patient: An Evaluation of Associated Factors in the Outpatient Population at the Bustamante Hospital for Children".

The Department hosted in July 2019, the JMMB Group and Joan Duncan Foundation sponsored 18th William Dennis Memorial Lecture and this was the final lecture chaired by the late Professor Barrie Hanchard. The lecture entitled, "Healthy Lives, Climate Matters" was delivered by Dr Michael Taylor, Dean, Faculty of Science and Technology, was a success.

The Department maintains three Academic Research Registries:

# The Trauma Registry

We had a complete overall of this registry with the now use of the open source software RedCap as a cost savings measure. Over 21,000 records continue to provide ample research material for injury related studies.

# The Intracranial Tumour Registry

Based in the Section of Surgery's Research Office is, constituted of over 1,200 patient records, utilising the software CNExT. This project is a collaborative effort between the Neurosurgery Service in the Section of Surgery and the Sections of Radiology and the Department of Pathology, UWI. It is a radio-clinico-pathological database of intracranial tumours.

# The Colorectal Cancer Registry

This registry maintains a database on all cases of colorectal cancer sourced from major health facilities across Jamaica. To date over 1,600 cases have been recorded since its inception in January 2011. This data allows for evidence-based research in the diagnosis and treatment of colorectal cancer and has been the source data for several abstracts presented at the annual meeting of the Association of West Indian Gastroenterologists in in April 2019 and the Annual Colorectal Cancer Symposium at the Jamaica Pegasus in March 2019 where the results of the first 1,000 patients were presented.

#### CLINICAL SERVICES

During the academic year the Department has benefited from increased support from the management team of the UHWI. This led to an overall increase in the total number and complexity of the clinical experience. The highlight of this was the creation of a multidisciplinary renal transplant team comprised of local faculty, Transplant Links Community and Dr Vaughn Whittaker transplant surgeon and adjunct lecturer in the Department. The patients transplanted are all doing well and are now dialysis free. Albeit that the programme is in its infancy, it has the full support and is actively engaged with the Ministry of Health through the National Health Fund to scale upwards to meet the burden of this chronic non-communicable disease on the population.

## **INFRASTRUCTURE**

The Department undertook the structural renovation of the Small Medical Lecture Theatre renamed in honour of former Head of Department and Professor of Surgery, PETER FLETCHER LECTURE THEATRE. Peter Fletcher was the doyen of surgery in Jamaica and died peacefully in May 2017. The renovation project, managed by Dr Mark Newnham, is funded by donations received from, the Tony Thwaites Wing, the Dean's Office of the Faculty of Medical Sciences and SURRADIC faculty members. The lecture theatre will be the main location for various multidisciplinary clinical meetings namely: Post-graduate seminars, Tumour Boards, Hepatobiliary Rounds, Mortality and Morbidity Grand Rounds, both locally and remotely with international partners. This renovation project, which when fully completed will cost approximately J\$12 million also includes the renovation of the adjoining male and female students' restrooms.
